Whether you are getting others on board for an idea they initially oppose or you want to open yourself to learning from others to improve your own thinking, open ended questions and holding another's agenda are essential skills for an innovator. One First Mover, for example, faced opposition from an influential colleague. He didn't try to convince him. Rather, he asked: "What would it take for you to say yes to this idea?" The question was disarming, causing the other person to break out of his habitual way of thinking.

In this experiential workshop participants will learn:

- The art of crafting powerful open ended questions for stimulating new ways of thinking and generating buy-in.
- How to hold another's agenda and fully take in another's perspective.

Collaborate Workshop: An Integrated Approach to Water Stewardship in Emerging Mega Cities.

This workshop will look across impact clusters and consider whether there is a project that Fellows could work on collectively. Fellows will be invited to share how their work does – or could – contribute to greater stewardship of water. Many dimensions of stewardship will be considered, including:

- Increasing supply e.g. desalinization using renewable energy, rainwater collection, run-off prevention, etc.
- Recycling existing water supplies water treatment and recovered water, different grades of water for different uses, etc.
- Improving water access e.g. building a network of public water-fountains/taps; decentralized filtration technology. Location-based apps, etc.
- Raising consciousness water quality monitoring; water savings mechanisms and reward programs; public art installations and other civic engagement programming, etc.
- Building resilience preventing flooding and other disasters.
