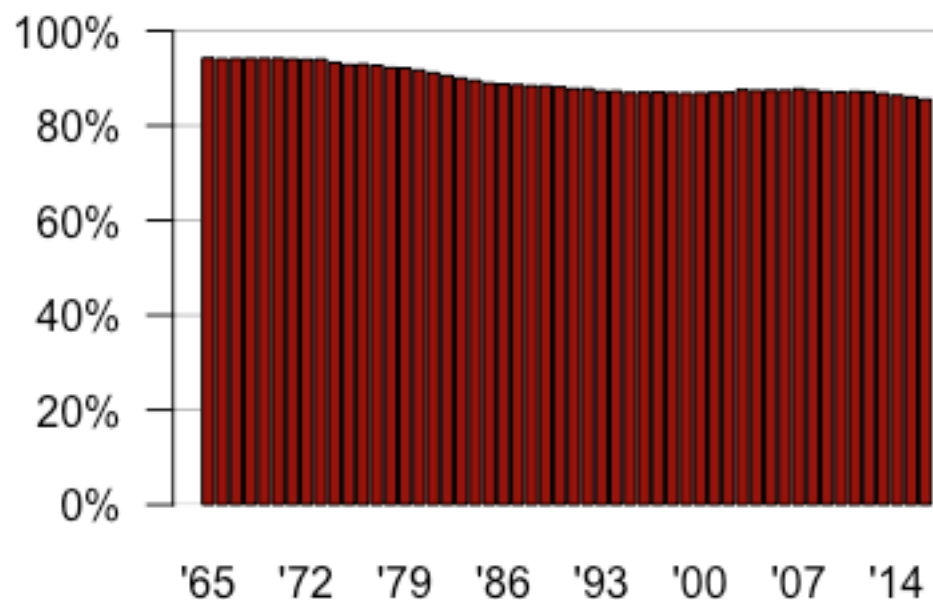


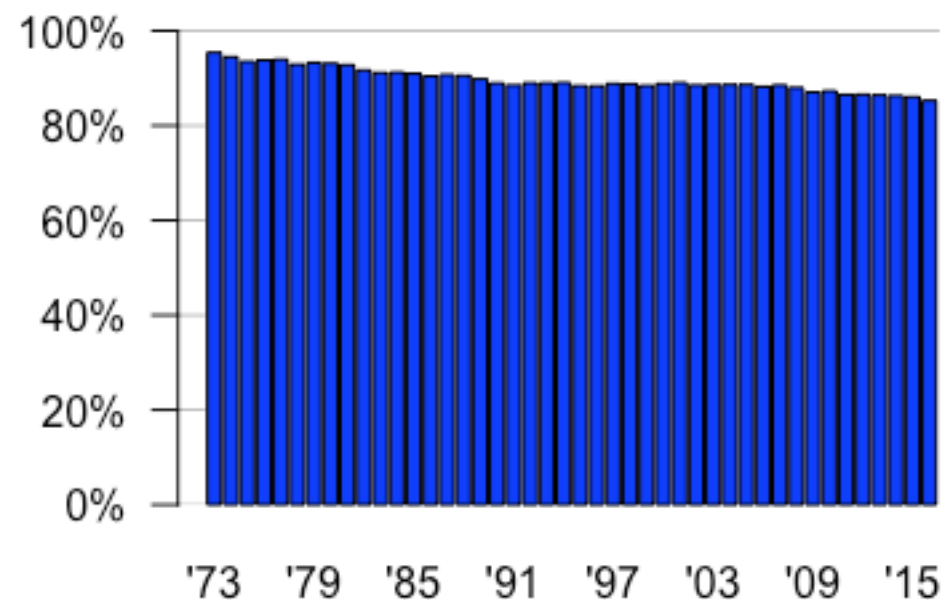
Percent of World Primary Energy from Fossil Fuels

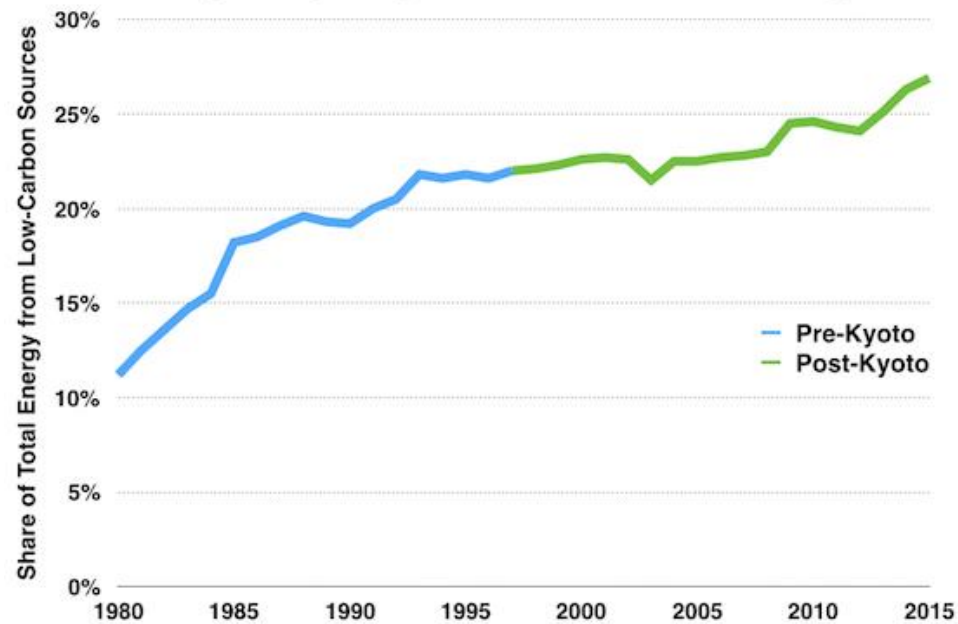
Percent of US Primary Energy from Fossil Fuels



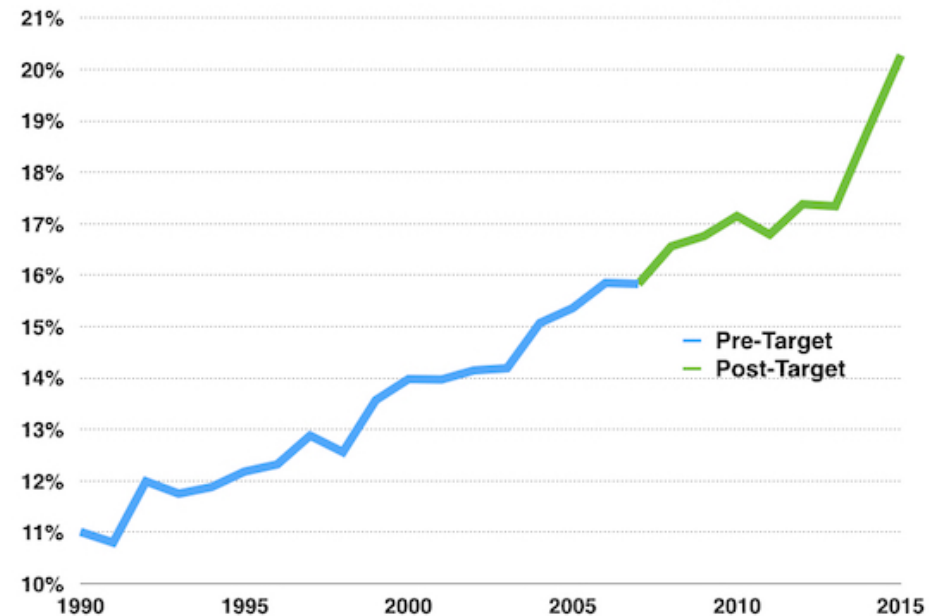

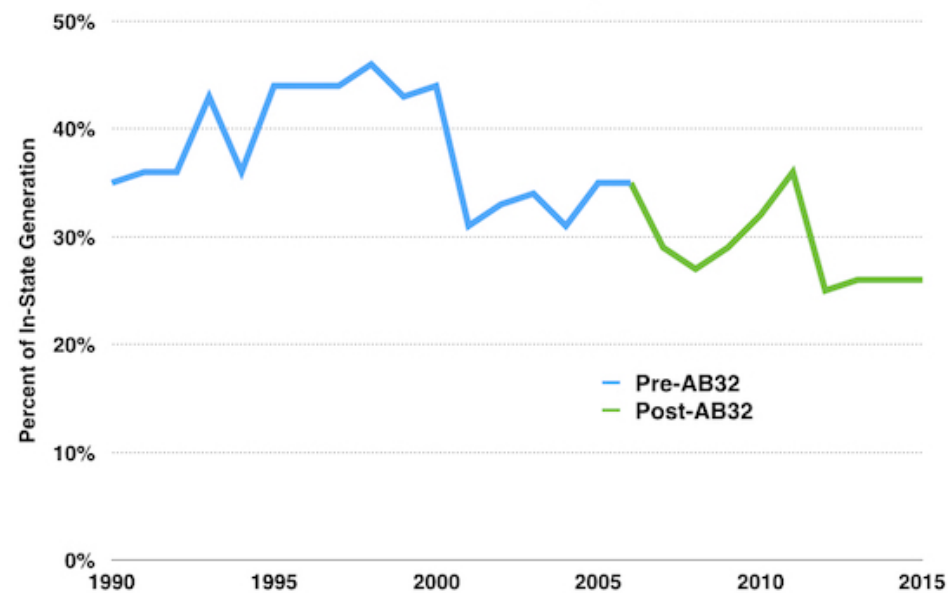
Kyoto Signatory Countries' Low-Carbon Energy



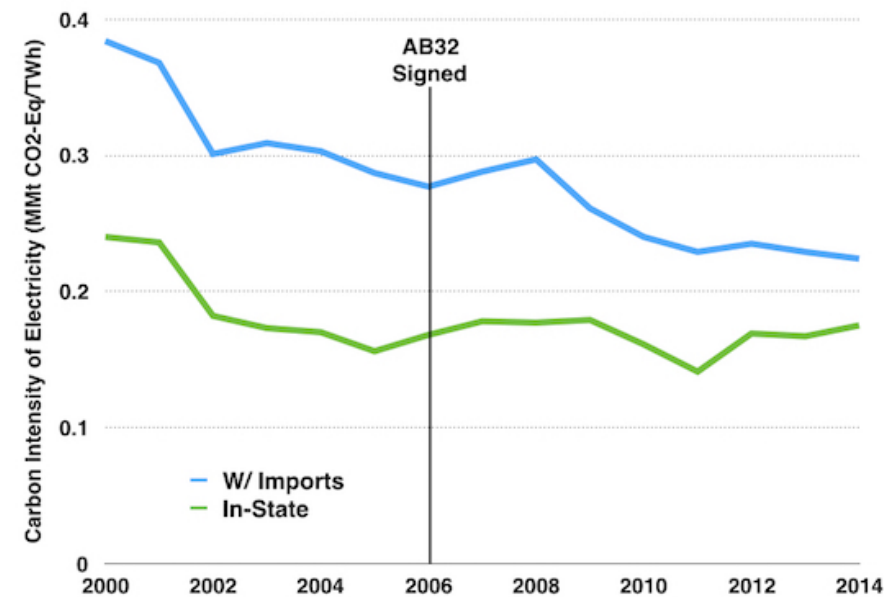
German Low-Carbon Share of Energy



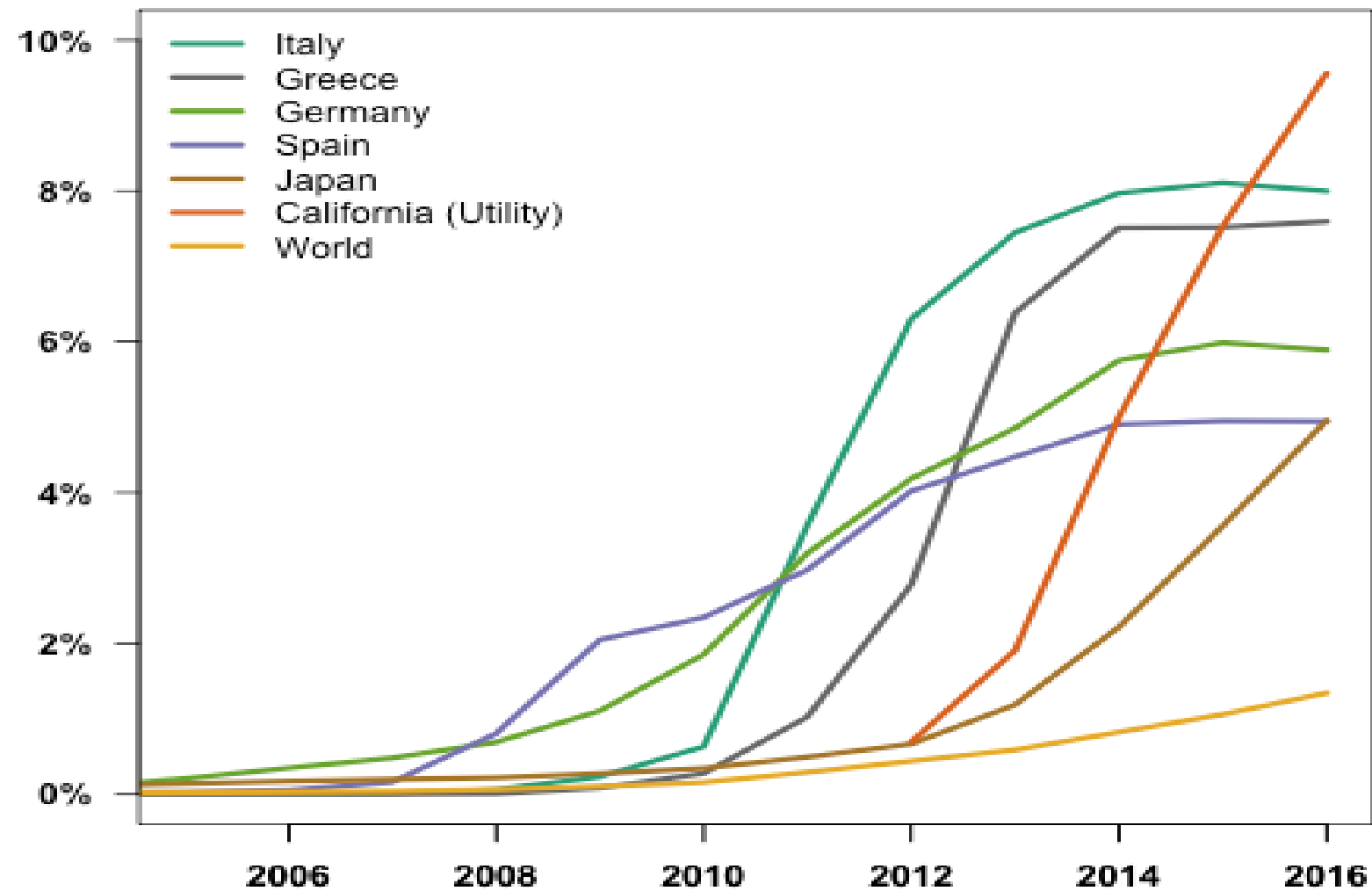
California's Share of Electricity from Low-Carbon

Solar as Share of Electricity

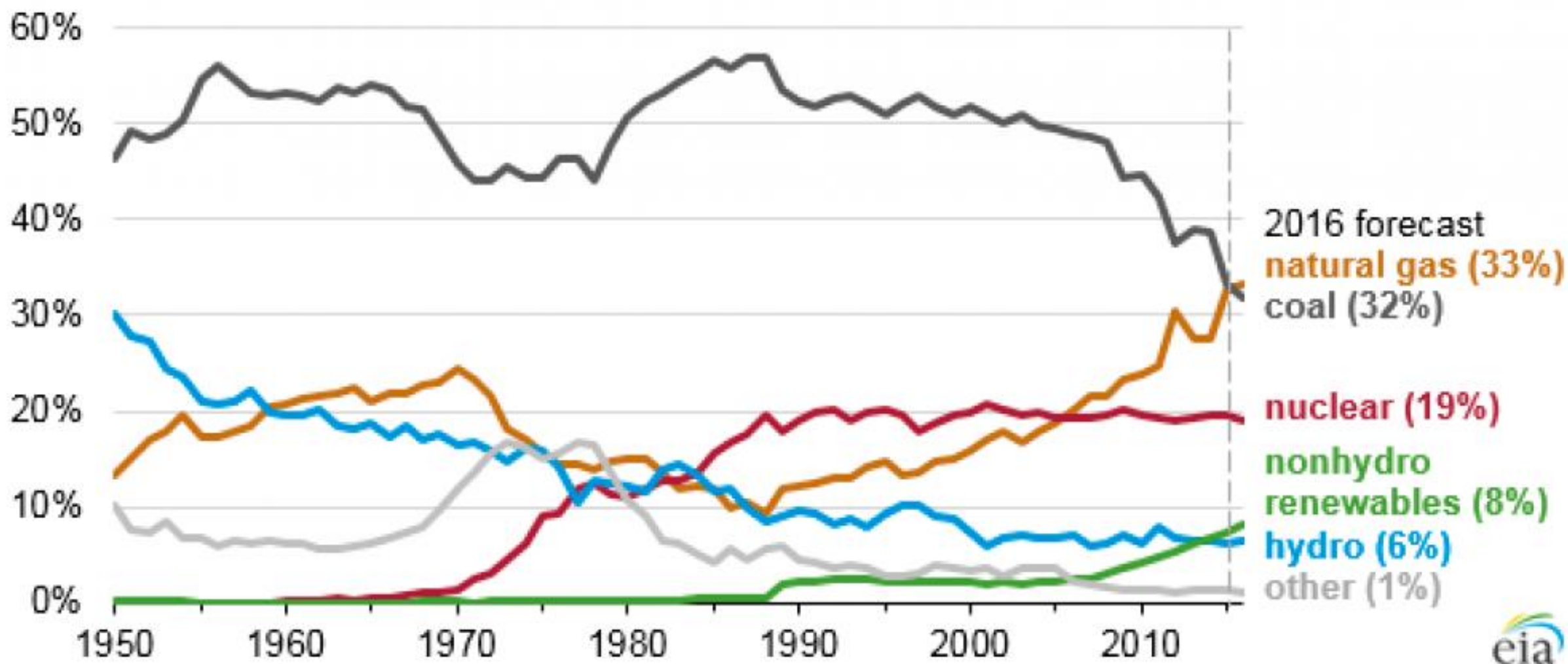

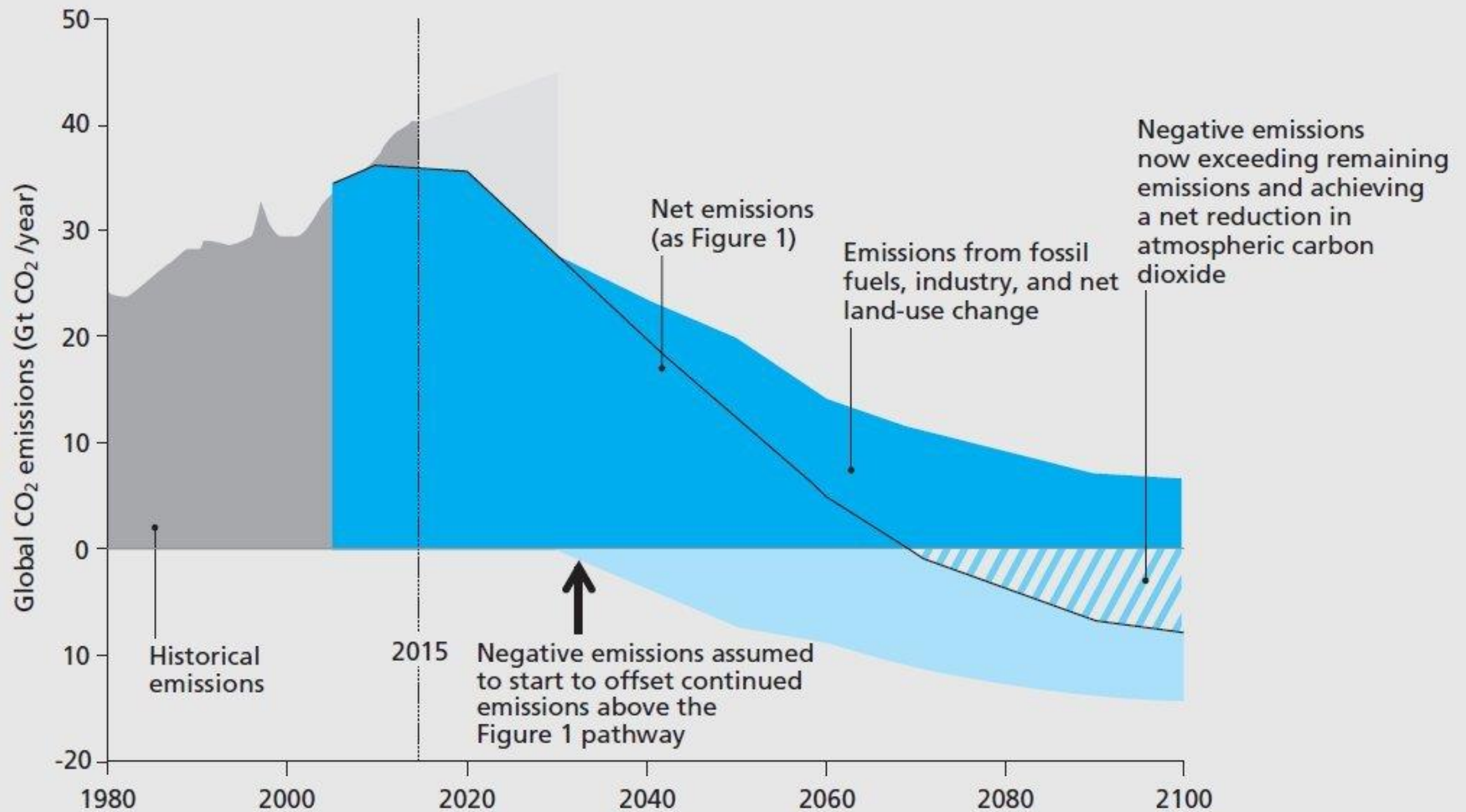


Figure 2 Inclusion of CO₂ removal in scenarios, thus allowing larger emissions without breaching the IPCC carbon budget. Source: adapted from Anderson and Peters (2016).
