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Kate Soules, Ph.D., is an education researcher and curriculum developer specializing in religious literacy and teacher education. Her research examines teacher education about religion, educators' conceptualizations of religious literacy, and student outcomes in secondary religious studies courses. Dr. Soules is the co-founder and executive director of the Religion and Education Collaborative (REC), an interdisciplinary network of scholars and practitioners working at the intersections of religion and schooling. She also currently

chairs the Religion and Education Special Interest Group of the American Education Research Association.

Dr. Soules has consulted as a curriculum specialist and program evaluator with organizations including the Religious Freedom Center of the Freedom Forum Institute, the Kaur Foundation, and International Baccalaureate. She has developed and taught courses about religious literacy and religious liberty for students of all ages, from elementary school through adult professional development. She was a 2019-2020 recipient of the [Religious Literacy Fellowship from the Foundation for Religious Literacy](#). She is currently a Religion & Society Program Fellow at the Aspen Institute focused on religious literacy evaluation.

Dr. Soules earned a PhD in Curriculum and Instruction from the Boston College Lynch School of Education and Human Development in 2019. She holds a Masters of Theological Study from the Boston University School of Theology and a Bachelors of Arts in Sociology from Wellesley College.
