









The Aspen Institute is an educational and policy studies organization based in Washington, DC. Its mission is to foster leadership based on enduring values and to provide a nonpartisan venue for dealing with critical issues. The Institute has campuses in Aspen, Colorado, and on the Wye River on Maryland's Eastern Shore. It also maintains offices in New York City and has an international network of partners.

The Aspen Global Leadership Network (AGLN) is a worldwide community of successful, high-integrity, entrepreneurial leaders, called "Aspen Global Leadership Fellows". Because of their demonstrated leadership accomplishments and abilities, these Fellows have been selected to be part of one of 15 geographic or sector-specific Fellowships around the world. These Fellowships include or are modeled after the Aspen Institute's flagship values-based leadership program, the Henry Crown Fellowship Program, launched in 1997. Fellows enter their program having demonstrated a great deal of personal success. They leave it inspired to make a greater mark on their communities and the world; to move as we say, "from success to significance." In between, they are provided with an intimate forum for deep introspection, probing dialogue and interactive problem-solving. The Aspen Global Leadership Network is designed to spur these Fellows to stretch themselves -- to take their leadership to greater heights and to broaden their impact to include society at-large. The Network connects Fellows through events like the Action Forum so that they can learn from, collaborate with and support one another. As of July 2013, the Aspen Global Leadership Network includes more than 1,600 Fellows from 46 countries -- and is growing. Fellows are using their businesses and their positions to create new ventures and jobs, develop medical devices for children, fight rare genetic diseases, improve employability, provide healthy meals to school children, promote environmental sustainability, reduce infant mortality, raise classroom engagement, stop ethnic violence, keep kids out of gangs, and battle corruption, just to name a few. ABOUT LYNDA RESNICK

At the age of 19, Lynda Resnick founded a full-service advertising agency. Running a successful business so early in life gave her invaluable hands-on marketing experience. Her sound entrepreneurial instinct, a passion for authenticity and a deep understanding of consumer behavior have been the hallmarks of her 50-year career.

Lynda has been dubbed the POM Queen for obvious reasons. In 2002, only 12 percent of the population even knew what a pomegranate was. Today, pomegranates are everywhere – in beverages, foods, nutritional supplements, even cosmetics – primarily due to the effective marketing efforts of Lynda and her team at POM Wonderful.

In 1979, in one of her first entrepreneurial forays, Lynda and her husband Stewart purchased a fledgling floral wire service called Teleflora. She had the inspiration to pair fresh flowers with a collectible keepsake container. This simple idea turned ordinary flowers into something more lasting and meaningful, and earned her a Gold Effie Award. Today, Teleflora is the world's largest floral service and floral products company.

In late 2004, Lynda and Stewart acquired FIJI Water. She quickly orchestrated a brand identity relaunch, with marketing initiatives that were as unique as the brand itself. FIJI Water is now the largest imported bottled water brand in the United States.

Lynda and Stewart also own Paramount Farms and Paramount Citrus Companies, as well as JUSTIN Vineyards & Winery and Landmark Vineyards. For Paramount Farms, she helped create the iconic Get Crackin' campaign for Wonderful Pistachios, a successful advertising and marketing campaign now in its fifth year.

In 2009, Lynda shared her marketing secrets in a best-selling book, RUBIES IN THE ORCHARD. Published by Random House, it was an authoritative guide to building memorable brands and creating fresh approaches to launching them.

In addition to her business achievements, she is Vice Chairman of Los Angeles County Museum of Art's Board of Trustees; serves on the executive boards of The Aspen Institute, UCLA Medical Sciences, the Prostate Cancer Foundation, and the Milken Family Foundation; and is a trustee of the Philadelphia Museum of Art.



In 2010, Lynda turned her philanthropic attention to California's Central Valley, where a large portion of her company's employees live and work. Her efforts resulted in the launch of the Central Valley Leadership Project, a multi-pronged program that focuses on K-12 education initiatives, nurtures future leaders and transforms low-income and underserved towns into hopeful and vibrant communities.

In 2012, Lynda was awarded a Doctorate of Humane Letters by Bard College.

The Resnicks are proud parents and grandparents and maintain homes in Beverly Hills, California and Aspen, Colorado.

Stewart A. Resnick is chairman and owner of Roll Global, a Los Angeles-based holding company that includes both global agricultural operations and well-known consumer-facing brands.

Among Mr. Resnick's companies are a number of Central California-based farming companies, including Paramount Citrus, Paramount Farming and Paramount Farms, the world's largest growers, processors and marketers of citrus, almonds and pistachios. His holdings also include POM Wonderful, grower of pomegranates and maker of the all-natural POM Wonderful pomegranate juice; Teleflora, the largest floral wire service in the world; FIJI Water, the largest imported bottle water in the United States; Suterra, the largest biorational pest control company in the United States; and more recently, JUSTIN Vineyards and Winery, an award-winning winery based in Paso Robles, and Landmark Vineyards, based in the Sonoma Valley.





Oxygen levels are lower in Aspen due to the high altitude. That coupled with the dry climate can contribute to the symptoms of altitude sickness — nausea, insomnia, shortness of breath, headache, accelerated pulse or nasal congestion. You can prepare yourself by staying well-hydrated, avoiding alcoholic beverages, keeping physical exertion to a minimum and taking in additional oxygen available at the Oxygen Bar in the Fuller Dome. An emergency medical responder is also available at the event. Please contact the nearest staff person for medical assistance.

Maria Blair most recently worked as the national vice president of the American Cancer Society, leading strategy and global operations. The American Cancer Society is the largest voluntary health organization in the world, with over 6,000 employees, 3 million volunteers and \$2B in assets.

Previously, Ms. Blair was Deputy Associate Director at the White House Council on Environmental Quality. children (OVC) by reducing their vulnerability through economic empowerment for the female caregivers in these households with sub-recipient funding from the Global Fund, ExxonMobil Foundation and USAID. In the year preceding this appointment, she took the lead on the transformative opportunity for the Massey Street Children's Hospital (MSCH), Nigeria's oldest children's hospital working with a team of independent experts. She served previously as Project Director for Africare's Technical Response to AIDS-Affected Populations (TAP) project in Nigeria as well as the pioneer Pediatric Advisor at Columbia University's International AIDS care and treatment Programs (ICAP). As Lady Gaga's manager, Troy-who has worked alongside the likes of Will Smith, Sean "Diddy" Combs, and the late Notorious B.I.G.-has helped cement the pop star's formidable online presence by cultivating and encouraging the philosophy of "fans first." 

In 2008, 200,000 people had VisionSpring glasses, sold by 1,000 female Vision Entrepreneurs in six countries. Today, 1.35 million wear VisionSpring glasses, with 8,000 Vision Entrepreneurs spanning 20 countries. It took 10 years to reach 1 million customers, but will only take two to double that—they reached 525,000 in 2013 alone. In 2009, only 8% of their budget was covered by sales; in 2013, that will reach 50%. In addition, El Salvador is now VisionSpring's first profitable country, with major regional scaling plans underway.

For over ten years, Ashesi has been a leader in undergraduate education in Africa, combining a liberal arts core with practical majors and ethics. 100% of Ashesi graduates find quality placement; 95% choose to stay in Africa. They launch new ventures, develop innovative solutions to local needs, and help grow Africa's private sector. In 2011, Ashesi moved to a permanent campus outside of Accra. This groundbreaking space will allow Ashesi to grow to over 1,000 students, add majors in engineering, economics and law, and expand recruiting and scholarships across Africa.

In 2010, Rocketship served 1,500 low-income students at three locations in San Jose, CA, pioneering a new model of personalized computer tutoring that frees up teacher time for new concepts. Rocketship now serves 3,800 students, to be expanded to 25,000 in five new cities by 2017. Rocketship runs the highest-performing schools for low-income students in California; over 80% of students scored proficient or advanced on standardized tests. In February 2013, co-founder John Danner stepped down after 8 years to begin Zeal, an online startup offering free education to a potential 2 billion students.

In 2011, the Prize honored Dele Olojede for starting NEXT, the first true investigative newspaper in Nigeria's modern history. With a team of dedicated young journalists, NEXT broke many important stories on government corruption, including revelations that the Oil Minister was on oil company payrolls, and the bombshell that a sitting president was brain-dead, and not merely ill as his ministers claimed. Despite NEXT's popularity and credibility, however, dedicated opposition from Nigeria's political and business elites (often indistinguishable), economically pressured NEXT and forced it to go on hiatus. It will re-emerge later this year as an online newspaper.

He also served as the Educational Technology Specialist at The Children's Aid Society, where he led the development of four "Technology Playgrounds" in Harlem and Staten Island, community computer labs in disadvantaged neighborhoods that have served as models of using technology to empower young people. Larry also developed (with Wireless Generation co-founder Greg Gunn) The Hole in The Web, an online extension of Paul Newman's "Hole In The Wall Gang" Camp for children with cancer and blood diseases. As a White House Fellow, Larry worked on Educational Technology at NASA, where he authored a vision of NASA's 21st century educational technology agenda, and did the conceptual design and early development of NASA BioBLAST, a curriculum module for high school biology. Larry has published numerous articles on education technology and the use of handheld computing to support diagnostic instruction. In addition, he is the co-author of I Will Sing Life, a book about the poetry writing program he developed and taught for children with serious illnesses, and of "Up Your Score: The Underground Guide to the SAT," a best-selling SAT review book that he wrote when he was in high school. 

"GORE VIDAL: THE UNITED STATES OF AMNESIA"

MARIA BLAIR

Catto Fellowship Program National Vice President, American Cancer Society UNITED STATES

Maria Blair most recently worked as the national vice president of the American Cancer Society, leading strategy and global operations. The American Cancer Society is the largest voluntary health organization in the world, with over 6,000 employees, 3 million volunteers and \$2B in assets.

Previously, Ms. Blair was Deputy Associate Director at the White House Council on Environmental Quality. She led an interagency effort to develop Federal recommendations for adapting to climate change impacts both domestically and internationally. with Pompe disease-a severe and often fatal neuromuscular disorder. In his drive to find a cure for them, he left his position at Bristol-Myers Squibb and became an entrepreneur as the co-founder, president and CEO of Novazyme Pharmaceuticals, a biotech start-up conducting research on a new experimental treatment for Pompe disease (which he credits as ultimately saving his children's lives.) In 2001, Novazyme merged into Genzyme Corporation and John continued to play a lead role in the development of a drug for Pompe disease as Senior Vice President, Genzyme Therapeutics. John and his family have been profiled on the front page of The Wall Street Journal and are the subjects of a book by Pulitzer prize-winning journalist Geeta Anand, "The Cure: How a Father Raised \$100 Million-And Bucked the Medical Establishment-In a Quest to Save His Children." The major motion picture, Extraordinary Measures, starring Brendan Fraser and Harrison Ford, is inspired by the Crowley family journey. John is the author of a personal memoir: Chasing Miracles: The Crowley Family Journey of Strength, Hope and Joy. John is also a commissioned officer in the U.S. Navy Reserve, assigned to the United States Special Operations Command and is a veteran of the global war on terrorism, with service in Afghanistan. He graduated with a BS in Foreign Service from Georgetown University, and earned a JD from the University of Notre Dame Law School and an MBA from Harvard. The Crowley family was the recipient of the 2011 Family Exemplar Award from the University of Notre Dame. He lives in Princeton, NJ with his wife, Aileen and their three children, John, Megan and Patrick. Jean-Claude Brizard is currently a Senior Advisor at the College Board focusing on developing the organization's career readiness initiative. He is the former Chief Executive of Chicago Public Schools. Prior to his appointment in Chicago, he was Superintendent of Schools for the Rochester City School

District (Rochester, NY). Under Jean-Claude's leadership, both the Chicago Public Schools and the Rochester City School District saw improvements in student performance. He introduced a comprehensive change agenda across the Chicago Public Schools, including closing a significant budget gap of more than \$1.3B over two fiscal years while preserving core reforms and investing in classrooms. He developed a new framework for teaching and the system saw record increases in student achievement, graduation rates and on college readiness benchmarks. Brizard also led the District's move to full adoption of the Common Core State Standards. He created a Blueprint for reform that will continue to serve as roadmap for years to come. Jean-Claude's experience also includes a 21-year career as an educator and administrator with the New York City Department of Education. He served as a Regional Superintendent, supervising more than 100 schools serving over 100,000 students in the Borough of Brooklyn and he also served as the system's Executive Director for Secondary Schools. Jean-Claude is a graduate of the Superintendents' Academy of the Broad Center for the Management of School Systems. Mashea Ashton is CEO of the Newark Charter School Fund (NCSF), a private foundation established in April of 2008 that makes grants to support the quality and sustainability of Newark's charter schools. NCSF is dedicated to improving Newark's charter schools and generally to creating a thriving public

school sector in Newark that prepares all Newark public school students for college and work. Mashea previously served as the executive director for the New York program and senior advisor for charter school policy for New Leaders for New Schools. At New Leaders, Mashea worked with over 100 New Leaders impacting approximately 40,000 students and families in New York City and Newark. BILL BROWDER

Henry Crown Fellowship Program (HCFP) Chief Executive Officer, Hermitage Capital Management UNITED KINGDOM

Bill Browder, founder and CEO of Hermitage Capital Management, was the largest foreign investor in Russia until November 2005, when he was denied entry to the country and declared "a threat to national security," for his battle against corporate corruption in Russia. In 2008, Bill's lawyer,

Sergei Magnitsky, uncovered a massive fraud committed by Russian government officials that involved the theft of US\$230 million of state taxes. He testified against the government officials who had committed the crime and was subsequently arrested and imprisoned by the same officers he had exposed. Mr. Magnitsky spent a year in prison under horrific detention conditions, was repeatedly denied medical treatment, and died in prison on November 16, 2009, leaving behind a wife and two children. Since that time, Bill has been leading a worldwide campaign using media, political and legislative tools to expose the corruption, rule of law and human rights abuses committed by Russian government officials. Thanks to this campaign, the 'Sergei Magnitsky Rule of Law Accountability Act' was signed into US law by President Obama in December 2012. The Act imposes visa entry bans and asset freezes on any of the Russian officials involved in the human rights abuses of Sergei Magnitsky, as well as on other gross violators of human rights in the Russian Federation. Bill is currently working with the Canadian Parliament, European Parliament, the European Commission, the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly, the Council of Europe and parliamentarians from several individual EU member states including Poland, Germany, Norway, France, Portugal, Lithuania, Latvia, Holland, Estonia and the Czech Republic, to ensure the implementation of the visa ban and asset freezes across the European Union as a way of seeking justice for the death of Sergei Magnitsky and fighting government-backed corruption in Russia. He holds an MBA from Stanford Business School and a BA in Economics with honors from the University of Chicago. Bill is a 2001 Henry Crown Fellow of The Aspen Institute and a member of the Aspen Global leadership Network.



JULIE GICHURU

Africa Leadership Initiative - East Africa (ALI-EA) Executive Director, Arimus Media LTD KENYA

Julie Gichuru is a TV Host and entrepreneur. Recently Julie launched the Africa Leadership Dialogues, a weekly talk show that airs on Citizen TV in East and Southern Africa. Janet Echelman builds living, breathing sculpture environments that respond to the forces of nature – wind, water and light – and become inviting focal points for civic life. Exploring the potential of unlikely materials, from fishing net to atomized water particles, Janet combines ancient craft with

cutting-edge technology to create her permanent sculpture at the scale of buildings. Experiential in nature, the result is sculpture that shifts from being an object you look at, to something you can get lost in. Recent prominent works include: "Her Secret is Patience" spanning two city blocks in downtown Phoenix, "Water Sky Garden" which premiered for the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics, "She Changes" on the waterfront in Porto, Portugal, and "Every Beating Second" in San Francisco Airport's new Terminal Two. Recipient of the Harvard GSD Loeb Fellowship, a Fulbright Lectureship, and a Guggenheim Fellowship, Janet was named Architectural Digest's 2012 Innovator for "changing the very essence of urban spaces." Her TED talk "Taking Imagination Seriously" has been translated into 33 languages and is estimated to have been viewed by more than a million people worldwide. She now lives in Brookline, Massachusetts with her husband and their two children. Janet is a 2006 Henry Crown Fellow of The Aspen Institute and is a member of the Aspen Global Leadership Network.

"The Art of Data" is an exhibition that explores how artists are helping us interpret and understand the world of big data. The project was developed by Henry Crown Fellow Peter Hirshberg in collaboration with bitforms gallery and was launched at the Aspen Ideas Festival. Its on view in The Doerr-Hosier Resnick Gallery through September 2nd.

Ours is the era of pervasive data: we are surrounded by signals and sensors that chronicle everything about our world and our lives. Web and mobile phone usage patterns reveal much about our behavior. Soon practically every device will be a connected device: our cars, fitness monitors, streetlights, and buildings will all participate in the data production economy. This represents a shift in the human condition, a shift in what it means to be human when everything about us can be quantified, measured, analyzed, and nearly permanently stored. All this creates unprecedented economic opportunity, but also new anxieties about privacy, identity and the nature of hyper-quantified humanity. Enter the artist, who has always helped us see the world in new and different ways. New technologies have also reliably led to disruptive advances in art: think what perspective did for the renaissance or how the portable oil tube enabled the impressionists to move outdoors and paint in natural light. So consider what a moment this is for artists as they embrace a new medium: the world of data.

The artists in *the Art of Data* exhibit are pioneers in developing the visual language that makes data captivating, expressive and meaningful. They follow in the tradition of filmmakers, photographers and pop artists who embraced new technology throughout the 20th century, and explored the intersection of commercialism and art. These works take us beyond literal data visualization (a staple of science, business and journalism) to help us see the unexpected in data, gain a sense for its cultural meaning, and make the otherwise abstract into an emotional experience. They don't provide ready answers, but rather ask questions about how data is represented, interpreted and used in society.
